## Orphanage



Immediately following our arrival we went to check on the Orphanage. The First action was to distribute the Girls4Girls envelopes (initiative from Monique to have 35 envelopes, filled with 'Girl things' by women and girls in the Netherlands). The girls were surprised and delighted. The timing could not have been better as all their personal cupboards had just been renovated giving them a private space of their own.

Also, the roof has been repaired and painted and the toilets renovated.

Important for the girls is that 120 new dresses have been made and 35 children will receive new school shoes.

The kitchen and dormitory have had a serious make-over and everyone is delighted with the result. Everywhere is now freshly painted and thanks to the new roof, the space where lessons and drama are given no longer lets the weather in.



# Prison

We made two visits to the prison this time. Firstly to bring essential items to the mothers and children living in the prison. With the help of the prison social worker a list had been made of what was needed. There are currently 4 children living in the prison but this number is often higher. The second visit, having now established the sizes required, was to take items of clothing for the children





and re-adjusted the agreement (a period exemption) but on the basis that we are able to see a serious desire and commitment on their behalf. These situations will be re-evaluated in December when a decision will be made regarding the arrears.

Obtaining a coach, permission from the local government (two officials went with the trip for the whole day), water and soft drinks, cake and cookies for everyone and on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> the girls assembled and left on the trip at 5.45 am. First a visit to the Zoo followed by lunch on the beach at Unawatuna, a trip to the Fort at Galle finishing off at a small festival. The month of May is the month of Buddha and there are festivals everywhere. This was an unique experience for nearly all the girls. They had never had a day out, never had lunch in a restaurant or been to the zoo. Fantastic to see how much they enjoyed themselves and they were singing loudly on the bus on the way home.
